## 一、 課程說明(Course Description)

課程前半段介紹文化(社會)人類學重基礎的研究概念與理論,著重閱讀學科的主要發展與關懷內容,並透過不同的觀點討論人類學在知識論上的特色。課程後半段選擇當代人類學研究的重要課題,呈現人類學研究現代社會的重要貢獻與新趨向。課程包括的主題有:當代人類學的處境、文化概念、社會概念、語言與結構、功能學派、實踐理論、權力與再現、文化與權力、關係性文化、物質文化與消費、宗教與消費、感官與身體經驗、文化與情感、民族誌與公共人類學等。

本課程希望加深同學的文化人類學基礎,並提供當代的人類學視野,希望幫助同學確認自己的研究與趣與方向。

## 二、課程要求 (Requirements):

上課以討論方式進行,修課同學需:

- (一) 在課前閱讀指定內容,並輪流作 3-4 次課堂報告,參與課堂討論與提問。
- (二)撰寫平時作業 4 份,在 15 個單元中選擇 4 個單元作書評報告,內容需以自己的話摘要 文本的重點,並提出對此文本的看法,例如舉其他的理論觀點作比較,或評論文本的內 容。每篇書評報告需 3000 字以上,請在每週三晚上十二點以前 email 給教師與上課同 學。請依規定時間繳交,不接受課後補交。
- (三) 期末報告:選擇個人感興趣的主題(選擇與人類學相關的主題,需經與教師討論、得到同意),進行相關研究文獻的閱讀,撰寫8000字以上的評論報告。報告內容需引用文獻至少8筆,評述人類學觀點對此主題的研究內容、貢獻、限制、與個人的想法。請在第十週確定報告主題,第十七週進行期末報告大綱的發表與討論。報告繳交期限為2016年1月15日下午5點,除非特殊原因或事先告知教師,不接受遲交。
- (四)報告書寫格式與學術倫理:書寫格式請參考台灣人類學刊
