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### Course Aims / Description<sup>1</sup>

#### 1. Primary aim

The course primarily aims to reinforce learners' English "cultural fluency." If language learners are culturally fluent in the target language, they are able to recognize and interpret effectively the hidden cultural currents of communication by employing words/ sentences (such as certain idioms and collocations , discourse markers, connected speech, and other pronunciation tendencies). Even more, learners are also capable of identifying when to follow or break grammar and pronunciation rules and other subtle mannerisms. Being culturally fluent also means to have the ability to respond effectively with vocabulary and slang that's common and appropriate in certain social circles. All of this can be learned from a regular diet of a TV series, as this is an important reflection of pop culture. Therefore, this course will have the F'R'I'E'N'D'S season 1, which is one of the most popular American sitcoms, as the main course material. All activities will be based on the episodes. There are 24 episodes in total in F'R'I'E'N'D'S season 1. The first 12 episodes will be focused in the first semester, and the other 12 ones will be focused in the second semester.

### 2. Subsidiary aim

To cultivate their cultural fluency through designed activities in the course, learners have to identify contexts with certain cultural references, and then to adopt proper communicative strategies by employing suitable and diverse vocabulary/ slangs.

## 101 The One With Where It All Began (The Pilot)

[Scene: Central Perk, Chandler, Joey, Phoebe, and Monica are there.] Monica: There's nothing to tell! He's just some guy I work with! Joey: C'mon, you're going out with the guy! There's gotta be something wrong with him! Chandler: So does he have a hump<sup>2</sup>? A hump and a hairpiece<sup>3</sup>? **Phoebe:** Wait, does he eat chalk? (They all stare, bemused.) Phoebe: Just, 'cause, I don't want her to go through what I went through with Carl- oh! Monica: Okay, everybody relax. This is not even a date. It's just two people going out to dinner and- not having sex. Chandler: Sounds like a date to me. [Time Lapse] Chandler: Alright, so I'm back in high school, I'm standing in the middle of the cafeteria, and I realize I am totally naked. All: Oh, yeah. Had that dream. Chandler: Then I look down, and I realize there's a phone... there. Joey: Instead of ...? Chandler: That's right. Joey: Never had that dream. Phoebe: No.

**Chandler:** All of a sudden, the phone starts to ring, and it <u>turns out</u><sup>4</sup> it's my mother, which is very-very weird, because- she never calls me!

[Time Lapse, Ross has entered.]

**Ross:** (mortified) Hi.

Joey: This guy says hello, I wanna kill myself.

Monica: Are you okay, sweetie?

Ross: I just feel like someone <u>reached<sup>5</sup></u> down my throat, <u>grabbed<sup>6</sup></u> my small <u>intestine<sup>7</sup></u>, pulled it out of my mouth and tied it around my neck...

Chandler: Cookie?

Monica: (explaining to the others) Carol moved her stuff out today.

Monica: (to Ross) Let me get you some coffee.

Phoebe: Ooh! Oh! (She starts to pluck at the air just in front of Ross.)

Ross: No, no don't! Stop <u>cleansing</u><sup>8</sup> my <u>aura</u><sup>9</sup>! No, just leave my aura alone, okay?

Ross: I'll be fine, alright? Really, everyone. I hope she'll be very happy.

Monica: No you don't.

Ross: No I don't, (1)to hell with her, she left me!

Joey: And you never knew she was a lesbian<sup>10</sup>..

Ross: No!! Okay?! Why does everyone keep <u>fixating<sup>11</sup></u> on that? She didn't know, how should I know?

- Chandler: Sometimes I wish I was a lesbian ... (They all stare at him.) Did I say that out loud?
- Joey: Alright Ross, look. You're feeling a lot of pain right now. You're angry. You're hurting. Can I tell you what the answer is? (Ross gestures his consent.)

Joey: <u>Strip<sup>12</sup></u> joint<sup>13</sup>! C'mon, you're single! Have some <u>hormones<sup>14</sup></u>!

**Ross:** I don't want to be single, okay? I just... I just- I just wanna be married again! (Rachel enters in a wet wedding dress and starts to search the room.)

Chandler: And I just want a million dollars! (He extends his hand hopefully.)

Monica: Rachel?!

**Rachel:** Oh God Monica hi! Thank God! I just went to your building and you weren't there and then this guy with a big hammer said you might be here and you are, you are!

Waitress: Can I get you some coffee?

Monica: (pointing at Rachel) <u>Decaf<sup>15</sup></u>. (to All) Okay, everybody, this is Rachel, another Lincoln High survivor. (to Rachel) This is everybody, this is Chandler, and Phoebe, and Joey, and-you remember my brother Ross?

Rachel: Hi, sure!

**Ross:** Hi. (They go to hug but Ross's umbrella opens. He sits back down defeated again. A moment of silence follows as Rachel sits and the others expect her to explain.)

Monica: So you wanna tell us now, or are we waiting for four wet bridesmaids<sup>16</sup>?

- Rachel: Oh God... well, it started about a half hour before the wedding. I was in the room where we were keeping all the presents, and I was looking at this gravy<sup>17</sup> boat. This really gorgeous Lamauge gravy boat. When all of a sudden- (to the waitress that brought her coffee)Sweet 'n' Lo?- I realized that I was more <u>turned on<sup>18</sup></u> by this gravy boat than by Barry! And then I got really <u>freaked out<sup>19</sup></u>, and that's when it <u>hit<sup>20</sup></u> me: how much Barry looks like Mr. Potato Head. Y'know, I mean, I always knew looked familiar, but... Anyway, I just had to get out of there, and
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I started wondering 'Why am I doing this, and who am I doing this for?'. (to Monica) So anyway

I just didn't know where to go, and I know that you and I have kinda <u>drifted apart<sup>21</sup></u>, but you're the only person I knew who lived here in the city.

Monica: Who wasn't invited to the wedding.

Rachel: Ooh, (2)I was kinda hoping that wouldn't be an issue<sup>22</sup>...

[Scene: Monica's Apartment, everyone is there and watching a Spanish Soap on TV and are trying to figure out what is going on.]

Monica: Now I'm guessing that he bought her the big pipe organ, and she's really not happy about it.

Rachel: (on phone) Daddy, I just... I can't marry him! I'm sorry. I just don't love him. Well, it matters to me!

Chandler: (re TV) Ooh, she should not be wearing those pants.

Joey: I say push her down the stairs.

- **Phoebe, Ross, Chandler, and Joey:** Push her down the stairs! Push her down the stairs! Push her down the stairs! (She is pushed down the stairs and everyone cheers.)
- Rachel: C'mon Daddy, listen to me! It's like, it's like, all of my life, everyone has always told me, 'You're a shoe! You're a shoe, you're a shoe, you're a shoe!'. And today I just stopped and I said, 'What if I don't wanna be a shoe? What if I wanna be a- a purse, y'know? Or a- or a hat! No, I'm not saying I want you to buy me a hat, I'm saying I am a ha- It's a <u>metaphor<sup>23</sup></u>, Daddy!

**Ross:** You can see where he'd have trouble.

Rachel: Look Daddy, it's my life. Well maybe I'll just stay here with Monica.

Monica: Well, I guess we've established<sup>24</sup> who's staying here with Monica...

Rachel: Well, maybe that's my decision. Well, maybe I don't need your money. Wait!! Wait, I said maybe!!

### [Time Lapse, Rachel is breating into a paper bag.]

Monica: Just breathe, breathe.. that's it. Just try to think of nice calm things...

**Phoebe:** (sings) Raindrops on roses and rabbits and kittens, (Rachel and Monica turn to look at her.) bluebells and sleigh bells and- something with <u>mittens<sup>25</sup></u>... La la la la...

Rachel: (3)I'm all better now.

Phoebe: (grins and walks to the kitchen and says to Chandler and Joey.) I helped!

Monica: Okay, look, (4) this is probably for the best, y'know? Independence. Taking control of your life.

Joey: (comforting her) And hey, you need anything, you can always come to Joey. Me and Chandler live across the hall<sup>26</sup>. And (5) he's away a lot.

Monica: Joey, (6) stop hitting on her! It's her wedding day!

Joey: What, like there's a rule or something?

(The door buzzer sounds and Chandler gets it.)

Chandler: Please don't do that again, it's a horrible sound.

**Paul:** (over the intercom) It's, uh, it's Paul.

Monica: Buzz him in!

Joey: Who's Paul?

Ross: Paul the Wine Guy, Paul?

Monica: Maybe. Joey: Wait. Your 'not a real date' tonight is with Paul the Wine Guy?

Ross: He finally asked you out?

Monica: Yes!

Chandler: Ooh, this is a Dear Diary moment.

Monica: Rach, wait, I can cancel...

Rachel: Please, no, go, that'd be fine!

Monica: (to Ross) Are, are you okay? I mean, do you want me to stay?

Ross: (choked voice) That'd be good...

Monica: (horrified) Really?

Ross: (normal voice) No, go on! It's Paul the Wine Guy!

(There's a knock on the door and it's Paul.)

Monica: Hi, come in! Paul, this is.. (They are all lined up next to the door.)... everybody, everybody, this is Paul.

All: Hey! Paul! Hi! The Wine Guy! Hey!

Chandler: I'm sorry, I didn't catch your name. Paul, was it?

Monica: (Shows Paul in) Two seconds.

**Phoebe:** Ooh, I just pulled out four <u>eyelashes<sup>27</sup></u>. That can't be good.

Ross: So Rachel, what're you, uh... (7) what're you up to tonight?

Rachel: Well, I was kinda <u>supposed<sup>28</sup></u> to be <u>headed<sup>29</sup></u> for Aruba on my honeymoon, so nothing!

**Ross:** Right, you're not even getting your honeymoon, God.. No, no, although, Aruba, this time of year... talk about your- (thinks) -big <u>lizards<sup>30</sup></u>... Anyway, if you don't feel like being alone tonight, Joey and Chandler are <u>coming over<sup>31</sup></u> to help me put together my new furniture.

Chandler: (deadpan) Yes, and we're very excited about it.

Rachel: Well actually thanks, but I think I'm just gonna <u>hang out<sup>32</sup></u> here tonight.

Ross: Okay, sure.

Joey: Hey Pheebs, you wanna help?

Phoebe: Oh, I wish I could, but I don't want to.

[Scene: Ross's Apartment, the guys are there assembling furniture.]

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Ross: (squatting and reading the instructions) I'm supposed to <u>attach<sup>33</sup></u> a <u>bracket<sup>34</sup></u>-y thing to the side things, using a <u>bunch<sup>35</sup></u> of these little worm guys. I have no bracket-y thing, (8)I see no whim guys whatsoever and (9) I cannot feel my legs.

Joey: (picking up a leftover part) What's this?

Chandler: (10)I have no idea. (Joey checks that Ross is not looking and dumps it in a plant.)

**Joey:** Done with the bookcase!

Chandler: All finished!

Ross: (clutching a beer can and sniffing) This was Carol's favorite beer. She always drank it out of the can, I should have known.

Joey: Ross, let me ask you a question. She got the furniture, the stereo, the good TV- what did you get? Ross: You guys.

Chandler: Oh, God.

Joey: You got screwed<sup>36</sup>.

[Scene: A Restaurant, Monica and Paul are eating.]

Monica: Oh my God!

Paul: I know, I know, I'm such an idiot. I guess I should have <u>caught on<sup>37</sup></u> when she started going to the dentist four and five times a week. I mean, how clean can teeth get?

Monica: My brother's going through that right now, he's such a mess. How did you get through it? Paul: Well, you might try accidentally breaking something valuable of hers,

(11) say her-

Monica: -leg?

Paul: (laughing) That's one way! (12)Me, I- I went for the watch.

Monica: You actually broke her watch?

### [Scene: Monica's Apartment, Rachel is talking on the phone and pacing.]

Rachel: Barry, I'm sorry... I am so sorry... I know you probably think that this is all about what I said the other day about you making love with your socks on, but it isn't... it isn't, it's about me, and I ju- (She stops talking and dials the phone.) Hi, machine cut me off again... anyway...

[Scene: Ross's Apartment; Ross is pacing while Joey and Chandler are working on some more furniture.] Ross: You know what the scariest part is? What if there's only one woman for everybody, y'know? I mean what if you get one woman- and that's it? Unfortunately in my case, there was only one woman- for her...

Joey: What are you talking about? 'One woman'? That's like saying there's only one flavor of ice cream for you. Let me tell you something, Ross. There's lots of flavors out there. There's Rocky Road, and Cookie Dough, and Bing! Cherry Vanilla. You could get 'em with Jimmies, or nuts, or whipped

cream! This is the best thing that ever happened to you! You got married, you were, like, what, eight? Welcome back to the world! Grab a spoon!

Ross: I honestly don't know if I'm hungry or <u>horny<sup>38</sup></u>.

Chandler: Stay out of my <u>freezer<sup>39</sup></u>!

[Scene: A Restaurant, Monica and Paul are still eating.] Paul: (13)Ever since she walked out on me, I, uh... Monica: What?..... What, you wanna spell it out with noodles? Paul: No, it's, it's more of a fifth date kinda revelation<sup>40</sup>. Monica: Oh, so there is gonna be a fifth date? **Paul:** Isn't there? Monica: Yeah... yeah, I think there is. -What were you gonna say? Paul: Well, ever-ev-... ever since she left me, um, I haven't been able to, uh, perform. (Monica takes a sip of her drink.) ... Sexually. Monica: (spitting out her drink in shock) Oh God, oh God, I am sorry... I am so sorry... Paul: It's okay... Monica: I know being spit<sup>41</sup> on is probably not what you need right now. Um... how long? Paul: Two years. Monica: Wow! I'm-I'm glad you <u>smashe</u>d<sup>42</sup> her watch! Paul: So you still think you, um... might want that fifth date? Monica: (pause)...Yeah. Yeah, I do.

[Scene: Monica's Apartment, Rachel is watching Joanne Loves Chaci.] **Priest on TV:** We are gathered here today to join Joanne Louise Cunningham and Charles, Chachi-Chachi-Chachi, Arcola in the bound of holy matrimony.

Rachel: Oh...see... but Joanne loved Chachi! That's the difference!

[Scene: Ross's Apartment, they're all sitting around and talking.]

- Ross: (scornful) Grab a spoon. Do you know how long it's been since I've grabbed a spoon? Do the words 'Billy, don't be a hero' mean anything to you?
- Ross: Y'know, here's the thing. (14) Even if I could get it together enough to- to ask a woman out,... who am I gonna ask? (He gazes out of the window.)

[Scene: Monica's Apartment, Rachel is making coffee for Joey and Chandler.] Rachel: Isn't this amazing? I mean, I have never made coffee before in my entire life. Chandler: That is amazing.

Joey: I will not take this abuse. (Walks to the door and opens it to leave.)

- Chandler: You're right, I'm sorry. (Burst into song and dances out of the door.) "Once I was a wooden boy, a little wooden boy..."
- Monica: So how you doing today? Did you sleep okay? Talk to Barry? I can't stop smiling.

**Rachel:** I can see that. You look like you slept with a <u>hanger<sup>45</sup></u> in your mouth.

Monica: I know, he's just so, so... Do you remember you and Tony DeMarco?

Rachel: Oh, yeah.

Monica: Well, it's like that. With feelings.

Rachel: Oh wow. Are you in trouble.

Monica: Okay. Okay. I am just going to get up, go to work and not think about him all day. Or else I'm just gonna get up and go to work.

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Rachel: Oh, look, wish me luck!

Monica: What for?

Rachel: I'm gonna go get one of those (Thinks) job things. (Monica exits.)

Monica: Is it me? Is it like I have some sort of <u>beacon<sup>48</sup></u> that only dogs and men with <u>severe<sup>49</sup></u> emotional problems can hear?

**Phoebe:** All right, c'mere, gimme your feet. (She starts massaging them.)

Monica: I just thought he was nice, y'know?

Joey: (bursts out laughing again) I can't believe you didn't know it was a line!

(Monica pushes him off of the sofa as Rachel enters with a shopping bag.)

Rachel: Guess what?

Ross: You got a job?

**Rachel:** Are you kidding? (17) I'm trained for nothing! I was laughed out of twelve interviews today. **Chandler:** And yet you're surprisingly <u>upbeat<sup>50</sup></u>.

Rachel: You would be too if you found John and David boots on sale, fifty percent off!

Chandler: Oh, how well you know me...

Rachel: They're my new 'I don't need a job, I don't need my parents, I've got great boots' boots!

Monica: How'd you pay for them?

Rachel: Uh, credit card.

Monica: And who pays for that?

Rachel: Um... my... father.

[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, everyone is sitting around the kitchen table. Rachel's credit cards are spread out on the table along with a pair of scissors.]

**Monica:** C' mon, you can't <u>live off<sup>51</sup></u> your parents your whole life.

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Rachel: I know that. That's why I was getting married.

**Phoebe:** (18) Give her a break, it's hard being on your own for the first time.

Rachel: Thank you.

Phoebe: You're welcome. I remember when I first came to this city. I was fourteen. My mom had just killed herself and my step-dad was back in prison, and I got here, and I didn't know anybody. And I ended up living with this <u>albino<sup>52</sup></u> guy who was, like, cleaning <u>windshields<sup>53</sup></u> outside <u>port</u> <u>authority<sup>54</sup></u>, and then he killed himself, and then I found <u>aromatherapy<sup>55</sup></u>. So believe me, I know exactly how you feel. (Pause)

Ross: The word you're looking for is 'Anyway'...

Monica: you ready?

Rachel: I don't think so.

Ross: C'mon, cut. Cut, cut, cut,...

All: Cut, cut, cut, cut, cut, cut... (She cuts one of them and they cheer.)

All: Cut, cut, cut, cut, cut, cut, cut.

Monica: Welcome to the real world! (19) It sucks<sup>56</sup>. You're gonna love it!

[Time Lapse, Rachel and Ross are watching a TV channel finishes its broadcast day by playing the national anthem.]

Monica: Well, that's it (To Ross) You gonna crash on<sup>57</sup> the couch?

Ross: No. No, I gotta go home sometime.

Monica: You be okay?

Ross: Yeah.

Rachel: Hey Mon, look what I just found on the floor. (Monica smiles.) What?

Monica: That's Paul's watch. You just put it back where you found it. Oh boy. Alright. Goodnight, everybody. (Monica stomps on Paul's watch and goes into her room.)

Ross: Mmm. (They both reach for the last cookie) Oh, no-

Rachel: Sorry-

Ross: No no no, go-

Rachel: No, you have it, really, I don't want it-

Ross: <u>Split<sup>58</sup></u> it?

Rachel: Okay.

Ross: Okay. (They split it.) You know you probably didn't know this, but back in high school, (20) I had a, um, major crush on you.

Rachel: I knew.

**Ross:** You did! Oh.... I always <u>figured<sup>59</sup></u> you just thought I was Monica's <u>geeky<sup>60</sup></u> older brother.

Ross: Okay... okay, maybe I will...

Rachel: Goodnight.

Ross: Goodnight. (Rachel goes into her room and Monica enters the living room as Ross is leaving.) Monica: See ya.... Wait wait, what's with you?

Ross: I just grabbed a spoon. (Ross exits and Monica has no idea what that means.)

**Joey:** I can't believe what I'm hearing here.

Phoebe: (sings) I can't believe what I'm hearing here...

Phoebe: (sings) What I said you had ...

Phoebe: Oh, was I doing it again?

Rachel: (walks up with a pot of coffee) Would anybody like more coffee?

Chandler: Did you make it, or are you just serving it?

Rachel: I'm just serving it.

All: Yeah. Yeah, I'll have a cup of coffee.

Chandler: Kids, new dream... I'm in Las Vegas.

Chandler: I'm Liza Minelli-
