Course Description:

The course aims to enhance students' English listening and speaking abilities through exposure to different kinds of listening materials such as news reports and videos, and a variety of speaking activities such as class discussion, pair work, and oral presentations.

The summary-reflection essay should be typed in <u>font size 12</u>, <u>Times New Roman</u>,

single spaced. No late submission of assignment will be accepted.

• Radio drama: Three to four students will form a group to produce a radio drama, which is to be recorded. A drama has to be 10-15 minutes in length. The project will be evaluated on content (50%), clarity of pronunciation and recording (25%), and background music and sound effects (25%). A script of the production has to be submitted on the day of the presentation.
