Course Description

This course is required for the students in the Department of English Instruction and is offered in the third year of the department curriculum. It is a TESOL-related course and is aimed to equip the course participants with the knowledge about English curriculum design. Elements of language curriculum will be discussed including (1) needs analysis, (2) goals and objectives, (3) language testing, (4) materials design, (5) language teaching, and (6) program evaluation. The course participants will gain familiarity with the terminology related to language curriculum design as well as hands-on experience of evaluating English curriculum.

The course participants will sit for two written exams (mid-term and final) and are expected to lead a group discussion on the assigned reading. Additionally, they are required to complete group assignments in class.

Medium of instruction of this course is English.

Instruction Modes

Lectures, group discussions, presentations.

Course Requirements

* Each group (consisting of 2-3 students) will lead a discussion on the text from the required textbook, focusing on one element of language curriculum. Students need to interpret and show a full understanding of the text assigned. Work assigned to each member in the group needs to be specified among the group members.

** Each group (consisting of 2-3 students) will complete two in-class assignments as required. *** Questions on the mid-term and final exams are designed through a cooperative assessment manner. Details about cooperative assessment are given in the first class of the course.

Class attendance is required. Absence without notice in advance is not accepted. A note from a doctor is required for sick leave. Each absence without proper notice and cause counts 1% of the course grade.
