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**Course Aims / Description¹****1. Primary aim**

The course aims to guide students to read and understand English news, to introduce the special usage and arrangement of English looking beyond the words to grasp critical concepts in a more systematic way.

2. Subsidiary aims

- Suitable for intermediate and high-intermediate students who desire to be able to read English news.
- All the reading materials based on various kinds of authentic English news articles.
- In-depth analysis and information about the special usages and structures of news English.
- A complete guide to understand English News, including the secret language of headlines, the features of news English ... and so on.

3-1. Corresponding CEFR Can-do statements (Reading /Reception/B2)

- Can-do statement #1 Can read with a large degree of independence, adapting style and speed of reading to different texts and purposes, and using appropriate reference sources selectively.
- Can-do statement #2 Can read correspondence relating to his/her field of interest and readily grasp the essential meaning.
