Primary aim

- understand the main points of discussion on familiar daily topics
- follow clearly spoken, straightforward conversations, short talks, and lectures
- express and share personal opinions in an informal discussion
- give descriptions on a variety of subjects covered in class

- develop and present a short talk on a chosen topic
- prepare for typical college exams and international assessments (part 4 of each chapter focuses on TOEFL testing)
