#### Course Description

This course aims to introduce several sub-areas in Applied Linguistics, including sociolinguistics, historical linguistics, language acquisition, psycholinguistics, neurolinguistics, and computational linguistics. Different professors from our department will be invited to give a guest lecture based on their area of expertise. The students will get to understand the basic issues and findings in these sub-areas of applied linguistics.

#### Class attendance / Participation

Reading Questions 15%

There will be assigned readings every week. You are required to submit 1-2 questions based on the reading every week. You need to write the questions in a small piece of paper (remember to put your name on the paper), and put it in a box at the beginning of the class. The guest lecturer will pick up some questions during the Q-A session and answer the questions. This is also a way to check the class attendance! The quality of the questions will be taken into consideration for grading.

#### Mid-term Written Report

25%

Detailed instruction for the reports will be posted on the website. You need to submit **both a** "hard-copy" and an "e-copy". The hard-copy should be handed in at the beginning of the class on the due day. The e-copy should be submitted to eeclass website by the deadline. Late assignments are <u>unacceptable</u>.

Final Exam 25%

The exam will test your understanding and the application of the materials covered in the lecture and in the textbook. Be sure to be carefully prepared for the exams.

#### **Group Project and Project term paper**

25%

The class will be divided into several small groups. Within the given selected topic, you group will discuss together and find an issue related to the topic, make observations, collect data and relevant information (e.g., interview/website info/recording, etc.), analyze the data, and write up a report for this class project. You need to make a project presentation (10%) and turn in the group project term paper (15%) at the end of the semester. The group work should be distributed equally among the team members, and every member's responsibility of the project should be indicated in the front page of the term paper. (The detailed instructions and guidelines for the project will be provided later).
