## **Course Description:**

The course aims to enhance students' English listening and speaking abilities through exposure to different kinds of listening materials such as on-line talks and videos, and a variety of speaking activities such as class discussion, pair work, and oral presentations.

- Attendance policy: You are allowed to have <u>three</u> absences (including sick leave, funeral leave, business leave, any kind). You will fail the course if more than <u>three</u> absences are recorded. You should also come to class on time. Frequent late appearance will result in the deduction of points.
- Cell phone policy: You are required to turn off your cell phone and put it away in class.
- Listening journal: You are required to keep a listening journal, *one entry* every other week, starting week 2. You are required to watch a TED talk and write a one-page <u>summary plus reflection</u> of each talk you watch, and turn it in the class of the following week. The summary-reflection essay should be typed in <u>font size 12</u>, <u>Times New Roman</u>, <u>single spaced</u>. No late submission of assignment will be accepted.

• Radio drama: Three to four students will form a group to produce a radio drama, which is to be recorded. A drama has to be 10-15 minutes in length. The project will be evaluated on content (50%), clarity of pronunciation and recording (25%), and background music and sound effects (25%). A script for the production has to be submitted on the day of the presentation.
