Course Description

This course is a required course for the students in the Department of English Instruction and is offered in the third year of the department curriculum. It is a TESOL-related course and aims to equip the course participants with knowledge about English curriculum design. In this course, elements of language curriculum are discussed including (1) needs analysis, (2) goals and objectives, (3) language testing, (4) materials design, (5) language teaching, and (6) program evaluation. The course participants will gain familiarity with the terminology related to language curriculum design. Furthermore, they will gain hands-on experience in evaluating an English curriculum. The course participants will sit for two written exams (mid-term and final) and are expected to lead a group discussion on the assigned reading. Additionally, they are required to complete group assignments in class.

Students enrolled in this course should be aware that they may not generate and submit assignments, reports, or personal reflections using artificial intelligence. If such usage is discovered, the instructor will reject the assignment or report and withhold scores. Students enrolling in this course agree to the above ethics statement if registering for the course.

Students need to interpret and show a full understanding of the text assigned. Work assigned to each member in a group needs to be specified among the group members.
- ** Each group (consisting of 3-4 students) will complete two in-class assignments as required.
- *** Questions on the mid-term and final exams are designed in a cooperative assessment manner. Details about cooperative assessment are given in the first class of the course.
