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Course Aims / Description

Primary aim This intermediate course is designed to provide students with an authentic Englishspeaking environment to practice the English language and to improve their overall English competence, especially in the areas of listening, speaking, and reading. Students will be able to build their confidence in communication with their fellow students through a variety of activities involving grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and language learning strategies. This course also aims to reinforce the use of language the students already know by giving them various language tasks in the classroom, and to encourage them to apply what they have learned beyond the classroom setting.

Subsidiary aim In this class, students will have opportunity to

- practice academic skills such as scanning, summarizing, and making predictions and deductions in relation to reading and speaking English
- review and use first conditional sentences to talk about a possible future situation and its consequence

- express their thoughts and personal opinions about abstract or cultural topics such as music and movies in an informal situation
- build up theme-based vocabulary through reading and listening to conversations, interviews, talks, and audio guides.
