#### Course Goals / Description

This course is an upper-intermediate level English course aiming to enhance students' English listening and speaking skills. With the course textbook titled "21<sup>st</sup> century skills: collaboration, communication, and critical thinking", students are able to practice their 4 skills in English through thought-provoking TED Talks. In terms of integrated skills, this course is also designed to develop students' 21st century skills such as collaboration, communication, global awareness, information literacy, and critical thinking. With all the authentic contexts provided in this course, such as university lectures, interviews, podcasts, and classroom discussions, students will be engaged in situational oral and public speaking activities to enhance their communicative and presentational skills.

#### Learning objectives

- Students will be able to communicate clearly and to collaborate with others in English in class activities.
- Students will be able to work independently and to be self-directed learners after class.
- When being exposed to multimedia presentations of information, students will be able to learn to understand them and determine their effectiveness.
- Students will be able to activate their background knowledge of the topic of the curriculum and connect their own lives to the theme.
- Students will be able to develop their digital literacy skills through online workbooks.
- Students will be able to use critical thinking approaches when processing new information and learn to reflect on and apply that information to a new situation.
- Students are encouraged to take charge of their learning before, during and after the class.


