Course Aims / Description

1. Primary aim

Keeping up with the news, amid various English learning resources, is one of the most efficacious ways to help students get a better understanding of the world and learn to express personal opinions on key issues. Unfortunately, having been studying English for more than ten years, many college students in Taiwan still have difficulty comprehending English news reports. Therefore, this course aims to equip students with effective listening strategies, develop their vocabulary and related background and cultural information in order to comprehend news broadcasts from a variety of sources, such as CNN, BBC, PBS, and ICRT etc. When successfully completing the course, students will be able to:

- i. listen for stressed words and get the gist of a news broadcast
- ii. identify important detail information (i.e. the 5ws and 1 h info) of a news report
- iii. extend and consolidate their vocabulary and listening ability in different fields
- iv. distinguish speakers' stances and the supports for their arguments in a commentary program
- v. appreciate the satires, humor and metaphors used in news reports
- vi. be more familiar with the historical or cultural background information of current affairs

- vii. develop critical thinking ability, discuss with others and express their own opinions on current issues
- 2. Subsidiary aim

Students will develop habits of listening to or watch news broadcasts on a regular basis.

3. Corresponding CEFR Can-do statements

When doing so, students need to provide their original version, the revised version by the AI, and a list of lessons or insights they have gained from the AI's revised version.

Attendance and Participation

Students are expected to attend each class punctually and actively participate in pair, group and class discussions. When not being able to come to class, students have to inform the teacher in advance and provide valid proof <u>within two weeks</u>. Students' attendance, punctuality, and class participation will be recorded for evaluation.

Attendance Policy

- ➤ starting point: 9 (起始點: 9 分)
- ▶ lateness: -2 (遲到: 2 分)
- ▶ absence: -5 (缺席: 5 分)

The starting point is 9. Each late arrival will cost you 2 points, and absence, 5 points. The accumulation does not stop at 0 or 15 points but has an upper limit when the score reaches 20. In other words, a negative attendance score will be carried over to influence your semester grade, but a strong positive attendance score will give you 5 extra points to your semester grade.

The more you are involved in each class, the more harvest you'll reap from this course.

News Broadcast Learning Log

Cultivating a habit of listening to the news every day is the most effective way to improve your English news listening ability, so that is the purpose of this assignment. In Week 8 and Week 15, students have

to turn in news learning logs#1-#3 and logs#4-#6, respectively. Each learning log entry should include the date, time duration, news link, summary of the news broadcast, at least 3 words or phrases learned, and personal response to the news. (See Appendix I for a template.)

- News learning logs #1-#3: focus on International News, Taiwan News and Business News (Due in week 8)
- News learning logs #4-#6: focus on Opinion, Science, Technology, Environment, Health, Arts and Leisure, and Sports (Due in week 15)

Project—Recording a News Broadcast

In week 10, students will have to sign up for news broadcasts emailed by the teacher and begin to write down the transcript, practice reporting the news, videotape their reports and post the video on eeclass by week 16. Their news report videos will be evaluated in terms of the accuracy of the transcript, pronunciation, articulation, fluency and competence, etc. A more detailed rubric will be announced later.

Final Exam

Scheduled in week 17, the final exam will test students on the vocabulary learned in class as well as news broadcasts with similar topics discussed in class or the most up-to-date news topics happening during the semester.

- 2. Take out a piece of paper and take notes when you watch or listen to the news 2 or 3 more times nonstop without caption.
- 3. You may repeat the parts that you do not understand.
- 4. Remember: YOU DON'T HAVE TO CATCH EVERY WORD IN ORDER TO UNDERSTAND THE NEWS REPORT.
- 5. Watch or listen to it one more time. This time, you may turn on the caption to check if your understanding is correct or not.
- Use your notes and choose some of the key words to write your summary. PLEASE DO NOT COPY THE SENTENCES FROM THE NEWS REPORT. USE YOUR OWN WORDS TO WRITE THE SUMMARY.
- 7. You don't need to follow the organization of the news report. Feel free to rearrange the order of the key words you jot down to come up with the best way to write an ORGANIZED summary.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: List at least 3 vocabulary words or idioms and look them up in the dictionary. Write down each word's English definition that applies in the article along with its part of speech (i.e. noun, adjective, verb, etc.) and one example sentence.

- 1. Please consult 'Longman Dictionary' or 'Cambridge Dictionary' first. If you can't find a suitable definition there, then use 'thefreedictionary.com.'
