Course Description:

 (\star) : It is required for credit-taking students to show up. Without show-up on time, the student is considered as being absent. Handing a short essay is mandatory for each class attendance. A maximum of total 80 points is for the class attendance and essay.

 $(\star\star)$: 10 points are for students' oral presentation.

 $(\star\star\star)$: 10 points are based on class discussion during Q&A after seminar talks.
