Course Goals:

This course aims to enhance students' reading ability with useful reading strategies. The designated textbook provides academic readings materials to consolidate comprehension across different fields. Students are guided from a great variety of reading passages so as to be familiar with contextualized vocabulary and various aspects toward issues. After input from all types of reading materials, students are encouraged to express opinions on related issues with the practice on presentation skills.

Course Descriptions:

Lecture, as well as group discussion, presentation, and language activities will help students get prepared for daily and academic reading tasks. Note-taking skills, vocabulary, and reading skills are designed to improve students' reading ability, while discussion, debate, and presentation would train student's academic communication. Requirements & Rules:

- 1. Class attendance, lesson preparation and active class participation are required.
 - (1) If you are absent in case of uncontrollable situations (e.g. illness, emergency, important occasions, etc.), please give me the valid proof <u>WITHIN TWO WEEKS</u>. (2) <u>If you miss more than 3 CLASSES (without valid reasons)</u>, you will FAIL the course. (3) <u>Being LATE for more than 20 minutes is treated as ABSENCE from that day's class</u>.
- 2. Absence from a class is no excuse for not knowing the assignment and what has been discussed in that class. Ask your classmates or me what has been covered in the class.
- 3. <u>Cheating</u> on the exam is <u>absolutely not permitted</u>. If someone is found cheating on an exam, it means he/she will get a zero point for that exam.
- 4. There will be **no make-up exams** unless you have valid and official reasons for absence **beforehand**.
