COURSE GOALS & DESCRIPTION

This high-intermediate English reading class includes vocabulary building, reading discussions, and it aims to help students develop intensive and extensive readings skills. By being active in comprehending the assigned readings, students will understand infographics and concept maps, analyze readings, infer meaning from context, summarize, paraphrase, identify main ideas, details, and supporting examples. Students are expected to convert the input: reading to the output: speaking and writing because English is a language that requires learners to apply the 4 skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. In this class, students are active learners, and they should be willing to engage in critical reading discussions with the instructor and their peers, present their theme-based 3-min presentations, and extensive reading journals to demonstrate the language skills they have been learning so far.

- Improve reading skills and develop confidence
- Go beyond the reading itself and form their own ideas and opinions on aspects of the topic
- Help students interact with the real world, as many exercises require students to go outside the classroom to collect specific information
