Students will gain the skills required to write academic research papers through a combination of theoretical talks and practical activities.	
Subsidiary aim	This course also focuses on developing the following skills according to Bloom's taxonomy: Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analyzing, Evaluating, and Creating.
